



Upcoming Opportunities to Pray and Get Involved



Because of Alabama Baptists, Christmas Backpacks has become a thriving ministry effort. In 2021 alone, 12,544 backpacks filled with gifts and the Gospel message were distributed through compassion ministry sites across the Southeast. More than 1,000 of those backpacks were distributed through nine Alabama Baptist Church plants in poverty-stricken areas of our state.

In addition, all requests for backpacks in the Mississippi River Delta were met, including sites hard hit by tornadoes. More than 1,300 backpacks were sent to ministry sites in Appalachia, as well. And more than 20 Alabama Baptist churches and

associations formed direct partnerships with ministry sites to help in the distribution efforts and ongoing ministry at those sites.

Alabama Baptists gave more than 12,500 backpacks filled with gifts and the Gospel message in 2021.

Here's how you can be a part of the Christmas Backpacks ministry:

- Pray! Begin praying now for individuals, churches and associations to participate in packing backpacks. Pray also for groups to be willing to partner with distribution sites. Pray for the logistics of coordinating and distributing 12,000+ backpacks across the Southeast lots can go wrong!

National WMU Launches New Project HELP Emphasis Focused on Mental Health

Project HELP is an initiative of WMU, SBC that identifies a critical issue, seeks to raise awareness about the issue, and provides practical approaches anyone can implement to open the door for both meeting needs and sharing the Gospel. Past Project HELP emphases have included issues such as poverty, human exploitation and refugees.

In September 2022, WMU will introduce a new focus, Project HELP: Mental Health. Between suffering a global pandemic, political unrest around the world, natural disasters, soaring violent crime rates and a worldwide economic crisis, it is vitally important for churches and individuals to understand the critical nature of mental health and its effect on society as a whole.

One of the first available resources for this emphasis is a book entitled *Joyful Sorrow* by former missionary Julie Busler, who currently serves as president of Oklahoma WMU. Julie understands the pain of mental illness

and has learned trials not only humanize us but increase our capacity to be used by God. This is the first of a number of resources that will follow over the course of this several-year emphasis on mental health and our response.
